## Proposed change to the Memorandum and Articles of Association

To be voted on by members at the Annual General Meeting of the Society, at Sea Temple Resort & Spa in Port Douglas, Queensland, on Sunday 1 October 2006

Clause 6. "Management" currently states:

#### **"6.2 Number of directors on the Executive**

(a) The Executive shall consist of not more than 8 persons as directors who shall be appointed in accordance with these Articles; "

It is proposed to change this point to read:

"(a) The Executive shall consist of not more than 9 persons as directors who shall be appointed in accordance with these Articles; "

It should be noted that 6.2 (c) states:

"The Society may from time to time by ordinary resolution passed at a general meeting:-

(i) increase or reduce the maximum number of directors;"

#### **Explanation:**

It is important for the Society's Executive Committee to function as smoothly as possible. In the past, there has been a significant turnover of Directors during some years, which is not ideal. Therefore, the Executive Committee proposes an ordinary resolution to increase the number of Directors from eight to nine. This will allow for more flexibility as well as consistency. Also, an uneven number of Directors prevents any potential deadlock in voting in the future.
